In honour of World Environment Day, **Gallery Huda** presents **'biotic-abiotic'**.

Featured in this exhibition are paintings and sculptures by 30 artists from diverse backgrounds and at varying stages of practice. From eminent, notable names in the art scene to young artists with exceptional talents.

The era we are living in shows us the possible extent of the destruction and depletion of our Earth's natural resources, but at the same time reminds us of the beauty and abundance all around us. This exemplifies the depth contained in all beings and the holistic, juxtaposed existence we live in.

HUDA's curation of artworks attempts to reflect this sentiment while empowering the ecosystem of Kolkata's visual art scene.

Paintings depicting riverbeds, village landscapes (both naturalistic and abstract), giving us a taste of the peaceful countryside, paintings showing early-morning beach scenes, and those of lovers depict the beauty of nature, love, and daily life.

Other artworks show us the simmering earth, the effects of global warming (as seen in 'Pressure Cooker – I'), and industrial machines.

Some other paintings bridge the gap between the two extremes. One example is 'Adipurush,' which depicts Lord Shiva, the lord of destruction, with a serene facial expression.

Artworks with religious iconography, such as 'The Second Coming,' depict the uncertainty of life in the 21st-century world and the hope that humans possess for change and rebirth.

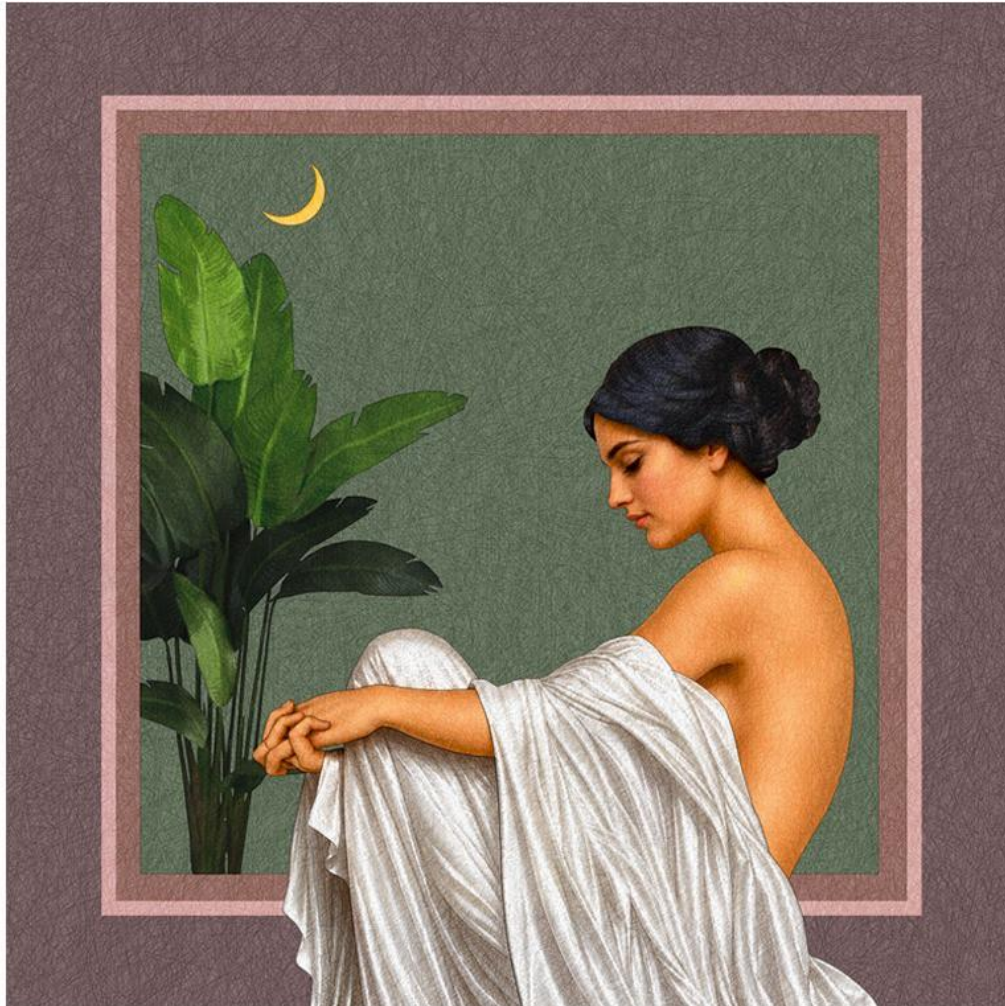
Apart from paintings, some striking sculptures made from various medium are also on display.

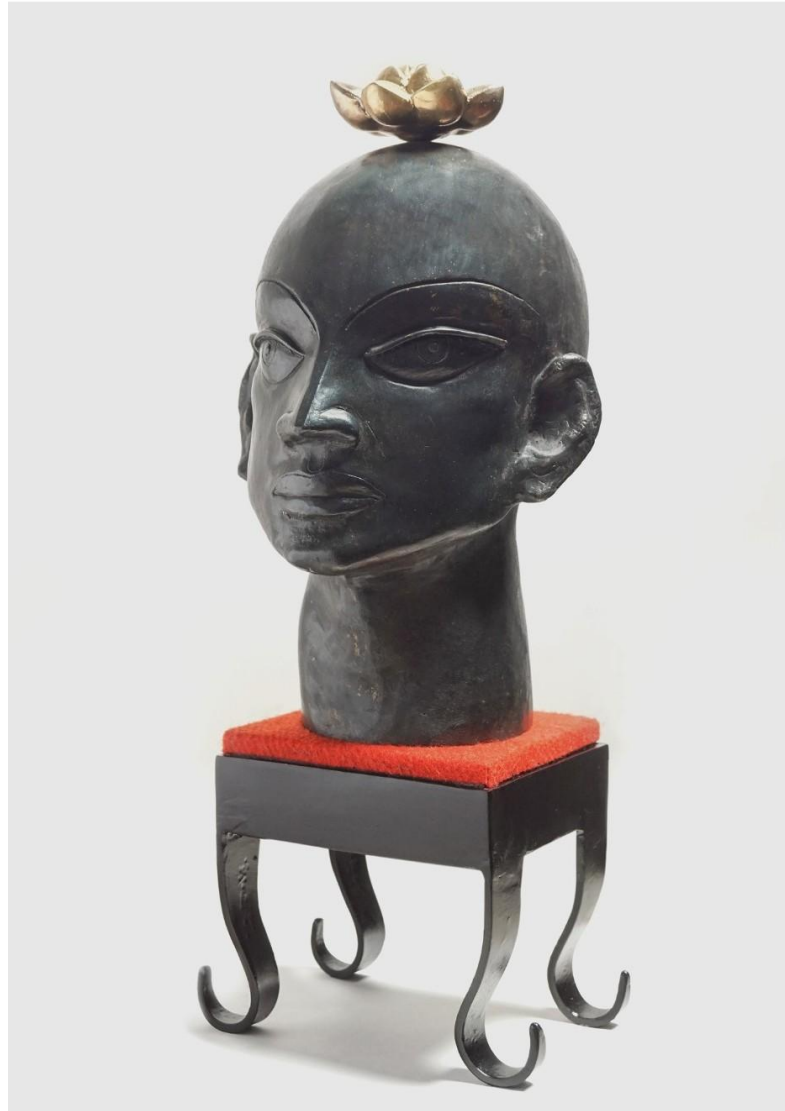

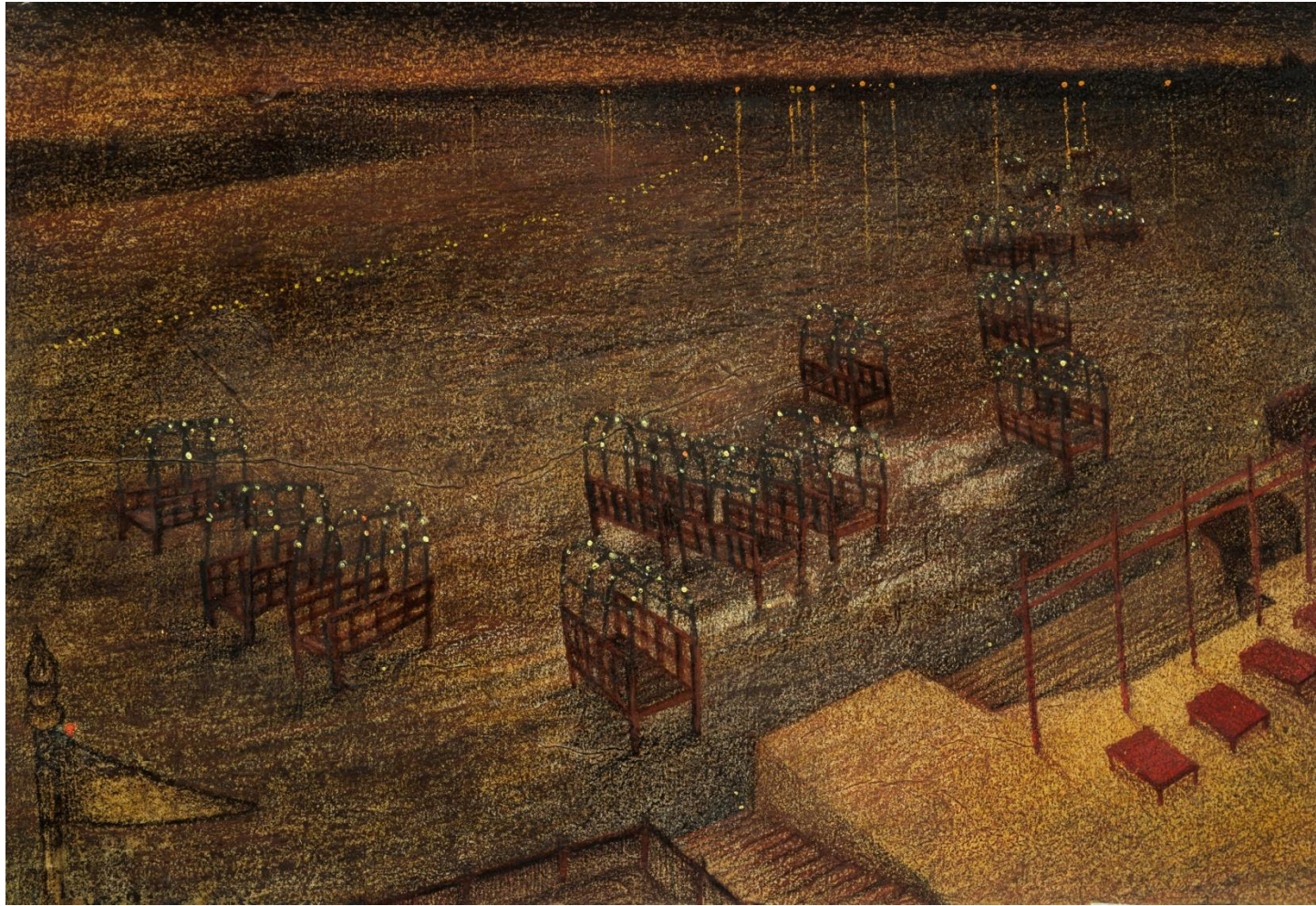

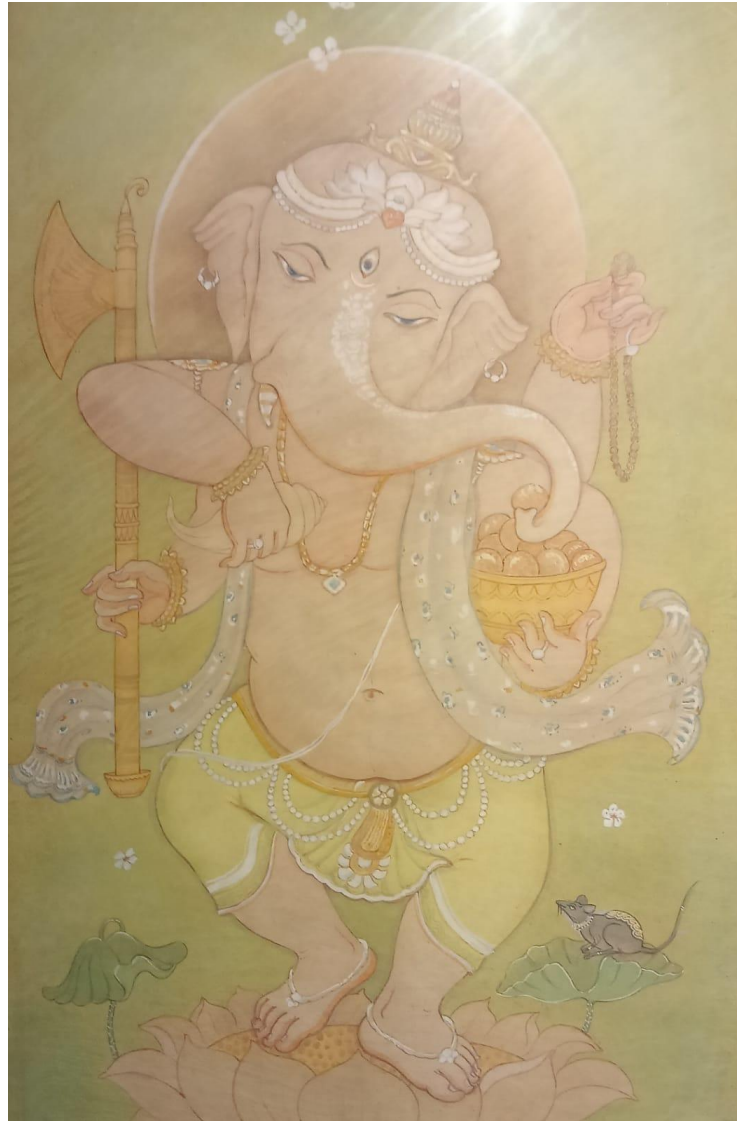

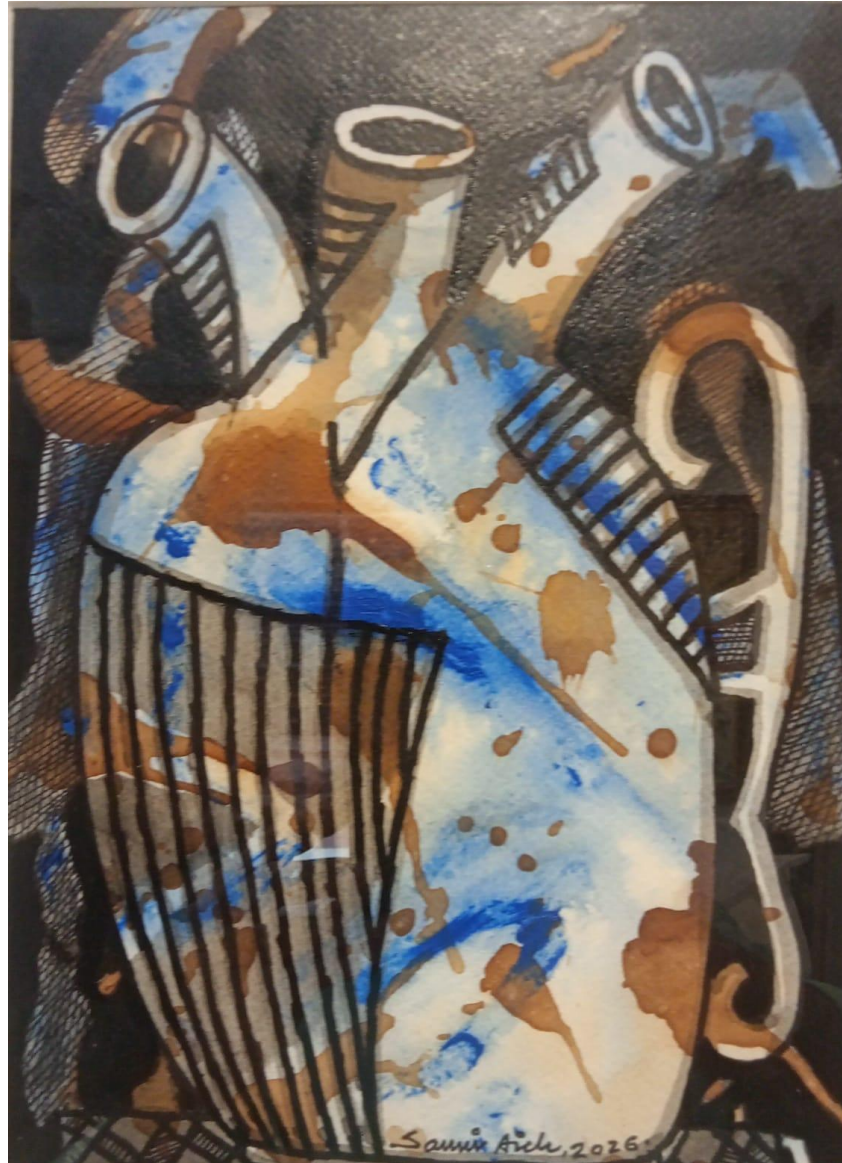

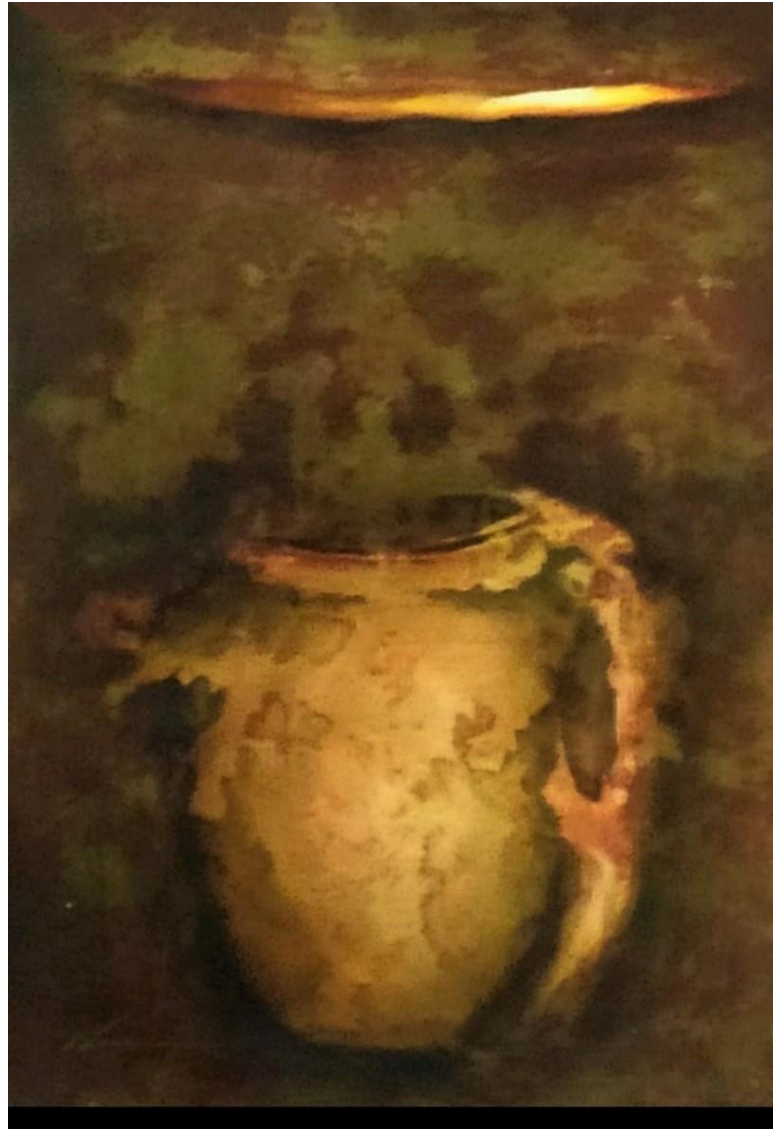

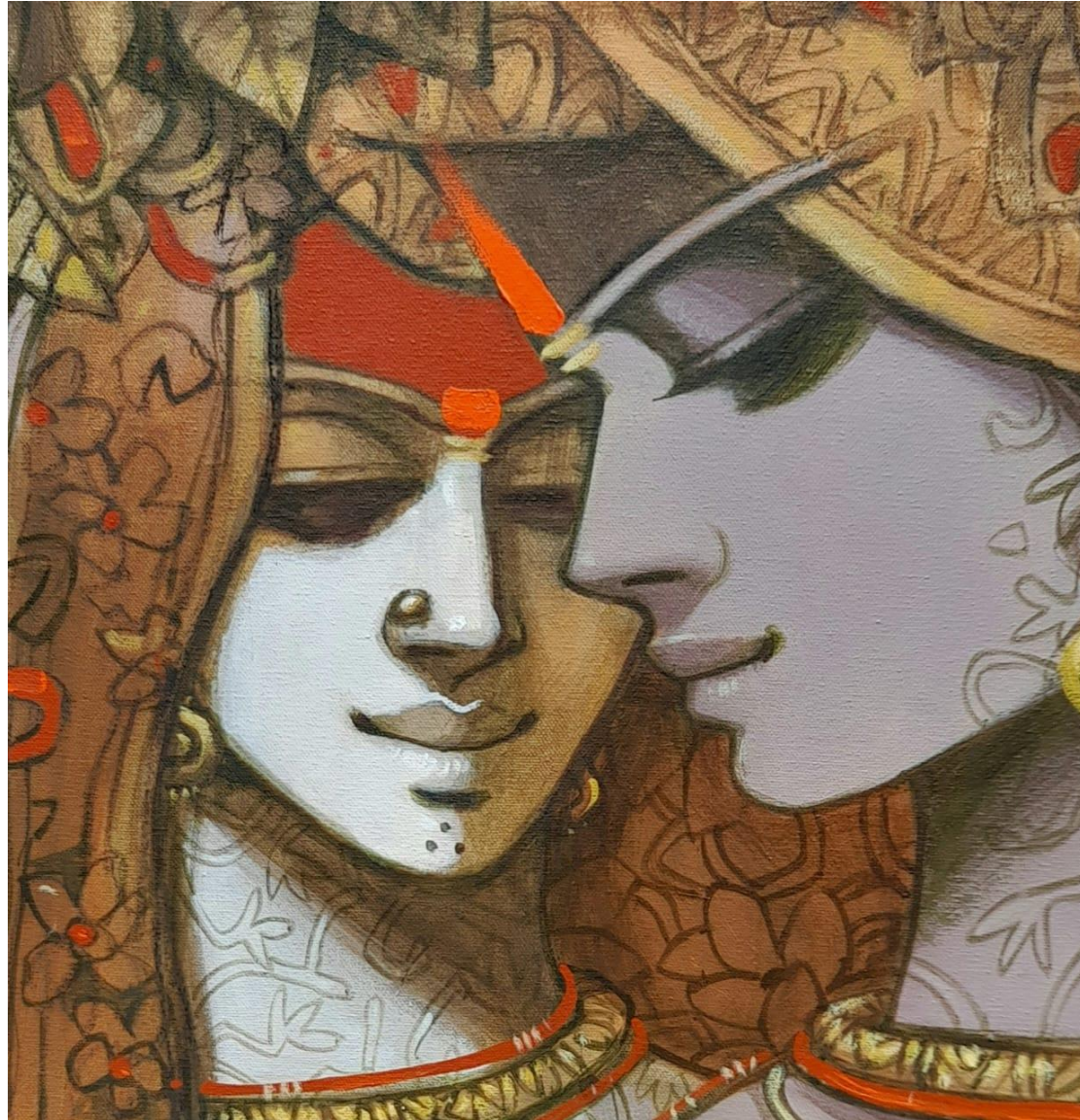

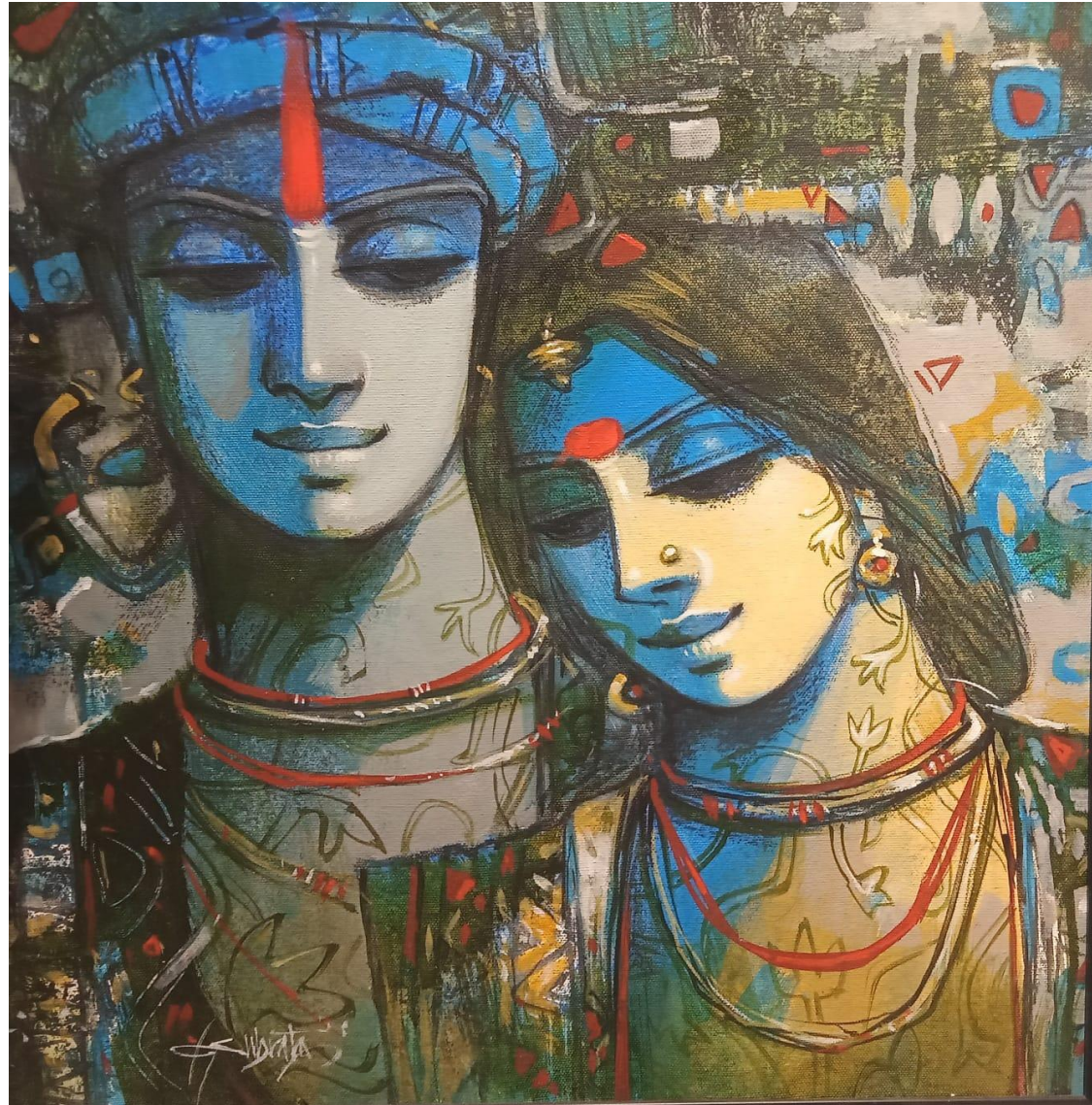
